In a certain sense, Fanon – s first book, Black Skin, White Masks, is an enraged meditation on the pathologies of colonialism, on both sides of the divide between the colonised and the coloniser, through categories of Hegel – s Phenomenology of the Mind, and especially the Master-Slave Dialectic.

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
